Summary of significant accounting policies.

a. Use of Estimates

In preparation of the financial statements, the Company makes judgments, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and the associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates

The estimates and the underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimate is revised and future periods affected

b. Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized for amounts the Company expects to be entitled to in exchange for transferring promised goods and services to a customer excluding amounts collected on behalf of third parties e.g. sales tax.

Revenue from contracts with customers is recognized when the Company satisfies the performance obligation identified in the contract through transfer of control of the promised goods and services.

Contract with a customer is accounted for when all the following criteria are met:

The parties to the contract have approved the contract and are committed to perform their respective obligations;

each party's rights regarding the goods or services to be transferred are identifiable;

payment terms for the goods or services to be transferred are identifiable;

the contract has commercial substance (i.e. the risk, timing or amount of the entity's future cash flows is expected to change as a result of the contract); and it is probable that the entity will collect the consideration to which it is be entitled in exchange for the goods or services that will be transferred to the customer.

Service income

Revenue from service transactions is usually recognized as the service is performed on conversion of customer's material by the percentage completion method. Processing charges include freight and packaging charges but are net of service tax.

Interest income

Interest income from a financial asset is recognized when it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the amount of income can be measure reliably. Interest income is accrued on a time basis, by reference to the principal outstanding and the effective interest rate applicable which is the rate exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to that asset's net carrying amount on initial recognition.

Dividend income

Dividend income from investments is recognized when the shareholder's rights to receive payment have been established.

c) Inventories

Finished goods are valued at lower of cost or net realizable value. Net realizable value is the price at which the inventories can be realized in the normal course of business after allowing for the cost of conversion from their existing state to a finished condition and for the cost of marketing, selling and distribution.

d) Investments

Long-term investments are stated at cost. Provision for diminution in the value of long term investment is made only if; such a decline is other than temporary in the opinion of the management. The Current investments are stated at lower of cost or quoted/fair vale market value computed category wise

e) Fixed, Intangible Assets & Borrowing Cost

h) Accounting for Taxes for Income

Adjustment of deferred tax liability attributable to change in tax rate is shown in the statement of profit and loss as a part of the deferred tax adjustment for the year.

These derivatives contracts do not generally extend beyond 12 months, except for certain interest rate swaps and cross currency interest rate swaps.

In cases where hedge accounting is not applied, changes in the fair value of derivatives are recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss as they arise. Hedge accounting is discontinued when the hedging instrument expires or is sold, terminated, or exercised, or no longer qualifies for hedge accounting. At that time, any cumulative gain or loss on the hedginginstrument recognized in equity is retained in equity until the forecasted transaction occurs. Certain components, such as terms and conditions, embedded in financial instruments or other hosts contracts are accounted for as separate derivatives and carried at fair value. These components are separatelyaccounted for when their risks and characteristics are not closely related to those of the host contract, the host contract itself is not carried at fair value with gains or losses reported in the Statement of Profit andLoss, and where a separate instrument with the same terms as the embedded component would itself meet the definition of a derivative.

The effectiveness of hedge Instruments to reduce the risk associated with the exposure being hedged is assessed and measured at the inception and on an ongoing basis. The ineffective portion of designated hedges are recognized immediately. In the Statement of Profit and Loss. When hedge accounting is applied: For fair value hedged, are recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss and Compensate for the effective portion the symmetrical changes in the fair value of the derivative.


